

Incident Investigation Checklist

Ask why? Use the categories below to get started. Keep asking why until you find the source of the incident.

Equipment Employee Tractor Did the equipment Are there written procedures for the task to be accomplished, if so, was the employee provided training? contribute to the incident Trailer through a failure, lack Is the employee physically capable of carrying out the Liftgate of feature or lack of tasks? Pallet jack maintenance? Did the employee wear the appropriate personal Hand truck protective equipment (PPE)? Other Is enough time allowed for workers to do their tasks Comments on equipment: correctly and safely so that they aren't tempted to take shortcuts? Comments on employee: Environment Light Did the environment Dark contribute to the incident? Management Wet Is management trained in hazard recognition? Heat Did management anticipate the hazard and the risk? Cold weather or ice Was management aware that a deviation from safety Uneven ground procedures might occur and take steps to prevent it? Indoors Is management's role in hazard recognition and corrective action clearly defined and assigned?
